The Sustainnovation Challenge program establishes a dynamic platform for collaboration among community stakeholders, local government, businesses, and industries, fostering meaningful interactions with local secondary students. Through this engagement, we aim to empower these students to channel their creativity towards addressing the challenges and seizing the opportunities inherent in our local communities and economy.

Challenge Description

We are connecting with and crowdsourcing ideas from next-gens, students between 13 – 17 years, to local problems or opportunities highlighted or aligned to regional and local government priorities.



Developing Mindsets

We inspire youth to solve problems with a human and planet-centric mindset, fostering value in human-centric thinking, technology, and innovation society-wide.



Building Networks

Students, government, business and industry come together to learn, explore, share and innovate.



Unlocking Economic Potential

Students are inspired to innovate and contribute to business and community growth in their local areas.



Challenge Event Schedule

Sustainnovation Challenge Partners collaborate to discover and define a challenge theme(s) that aligns with their local government (LGA) or broader area's development strategies and plans.

Students (~60) from across the LGA/area are invited to participate in a two-day experience, virtual and face-to-face. Looking through local, sustainable development and smart place lens, students discover and connect with problems or challenges they would like to work on or solve.





Day 1

Local and regional leaders, academic, government, business, industry and community representatives provide context, helping the students to discover challenge themes and opportunities for innovation in their local areas.



Day 2

Students are empowered to unleash their thinking, share their ideas and perspectives on overcoming challenges, or find opportunities to innovate within the challenge themes.

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Project Timeline



The team at MCB Business Partners, collaborating closely with a designated council team, will manage the end-to-end delivery of the Sustainnovation Challenge.

Discovery	Define project objectives, desired outcomes and overall purpose. Identify key stakeholders. Agree on the key milestones, schedule and deliverables, and create the delivery plan.
Design	Curate and design the challenge program, including establishing the 'student journey' sequence and confirming speakers and supporters to participate in the challenge.
Promote	Develop collateral and website landing pages that will be used to promote the program to schools and stakeholders to promote their involvement in the delivery/facilitation of the program.

Activate	Manage the administration of the challenge, including compliance, school onboarding, event communications and public relations.
Deliver	The Sustainnovation Challenge team will facilitate the delivery of the challenge over the two days.

Measure, monitor, and evaluate the performance of a Sustainnovation Challenge.
